

WHS Policy

Workplace Health and Safety is of critical importance in the planning, organisation and undertaking of Triple I's operations.

Triple I recognise its moral and legal responsibilities under Work Health and Safety (WHS) legislation to provide a safe and healthy work environment.

This commitment means that we shall:

- Provide a safe and healthy workplace and working conditions for all workers, customers and visitors;
- Provide information, instruction and training for all workers to increase personal understanding of workplace hazards and ensure proper supervision;
- Comply with all relevant statutory duties, regulations, advisory standards and industry codes and standards, making adequate provision of resources to meet these requirements;
- Involve workers on health and safety matters and consult with them on ways to reduce workplace hazards and improve hazard control systems;
- Encourage workers to report all accidents, incidents and near misses
- Respond appropriately to any accident or incident and conduct investigations into all reported incidents;
- Provide support, assistance, and resources to ensure an integrated rehabilitation program for all workers who sustain injury and illness;
- Conduct regular audits, reviews and evaluations of the health and safety systems in place.
- Develop action plans each year to ensure we deliver each of our WHS policy objectives.

While at work, all workers, irrespective of their position shall:

- Take reasonable care to ensure good health and safety procedures are implemented at all times;
- Identify and support measures to eliminate or minimise unsafe conditions;
- Assume personal responsibility for their safety and the safety of other workers by always operating in a safe and appropriate manner.
